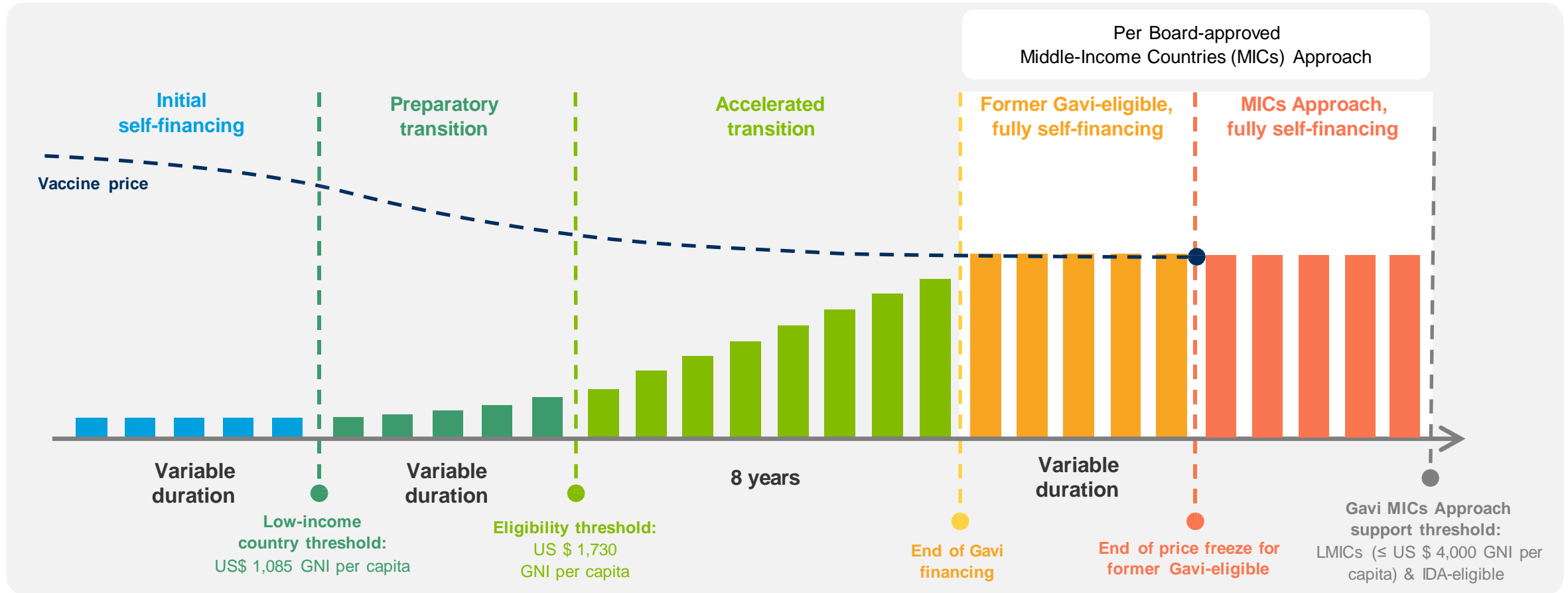

Gavi's Gender Policy

Focuses on overcoming gender-related barriers faced primarily by caregivers, health workers and adolescents who are central to reaching zero-dose and underimmunised children, individuals and communities.



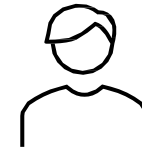
Caregivers

- Address barriers to accessing services
- Opportunity to encourage men's participation



Health workers

- >70% of health workers globally are women
- Ensure safety, security and fair compensation

- HPV vaccine for 9–14-year-olds.
